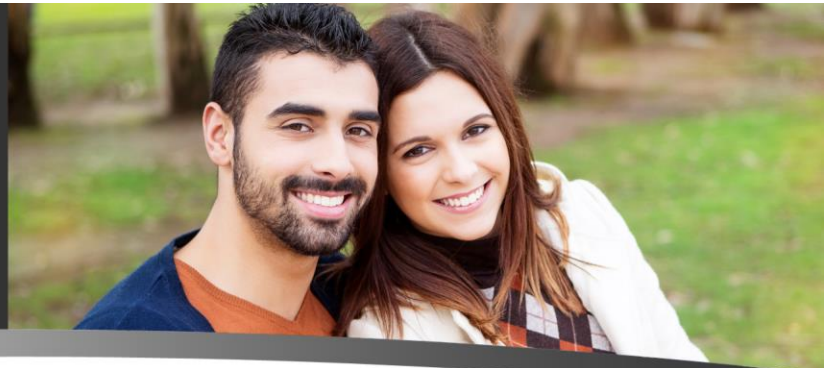


Top 10 Benefits to Getting a Vasectomy
